## GAME "Mission JAPAN at NCU Rules and Regulations

- 1. **Organizer.** The field game "Mission JAPAN at NCU" is organized by the NCU Department of Promotion and Communication (DPC).
- 2. **Participants.** The game is open to members of the Nicolaus Copernicus University community. Participation is free of charge.
- 3. **Duration.** The competition begins on Monday, October 6, 2025, at 8:00 a.m. and ends on October 17, 2025, at 3:00 p.m.
- 4. **Tasks**. To participate, players must collect a starter card at the headquarters of the DPC (Reja 25). Starter cards are distributed on weekdays, Monday–Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The starter card contains the tasks, a sheet of origami paper, and the game regulations.
- 5. **Answers.** Completion of each task must be confirmed on the received starter card. Depending on the type of task, the designated field should contain a written answer, a photo, or origami. There are 6 tasks in total. Participants are not required to complete all tasks.
- 6. **Submission.** Cards with completed tasks must be submitted to the DPC (Reja 25) between October 6–17, 2025 (weekdays, Monday–Friday), from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. When submitting the card, participants must sign a consent form for the use of their personal data for the purpose of informing them about a possible prize. Each card will be assigned an individual number linked to the participant. The number will also be entered on the personal data consent form.
- 7. **Scoring.** Each task will be awarded between 0–5 points, where 0 is the lowest score and 5 the highest. Creative tasks will be evaluated by a three-member jury: Urszula Sęczyk-Bonczkowska from the NCU Department of Promotion and Communication (Promotion Section), Michał Bomastyk, and Bartosz Zdunowski from the Research and Project Support Unit (IDUB Programme Section).
- 8. **Tie-breaking.** In case that multiple participants achieve the same score, the jury will decide the awarding of prizes.
- 9. **Results.** The results will be announced on October 22, 2025, on the NCU Information Portal. Winners will also be notified by email to the address they provided, with details on how to collect their prize.
- 10. Prizes. The 20 participants with the highest scores (positions 1–20 on the ranking list) will receive the main prize: a sweatshirt (size L) from the limited Harmony of Cooperation collection a line promoting the scientific symposium at Kobe University.
  The 10 participants ranked 21–30 will receive an NCU gadget set.
- 11. **Prize collection.** Prizes can be collected at the NCU Department of Promotion and Communication (Reja 25), on weekdays (Monday–Friday), from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
