

Detailed rules for the use of student dormitories

1. General rules:

- 1) Everyone entering the student dormitory is required to disinfect their hands with a disinfectant available at the entrance to the building.
- 2) All residents are obliged to observe the rules of social distance, to keep a minimum distance of 1.5 metres from other persons and, in particular, to avoid congregating.
- 3) All residents of the student dormitory are required to cover their mouths and noses with a mask when using the common areas and when moving around the premises.
- 4) Used personal protective equipment must be disposed of in designated containers.
- 5) Restrictions on the number of people and hours of occupancy in common areas and notices posted on the doors of these areas must be observed.
- 6) The use of automatic hand dryers in common areas is not recommended.
- 7) Residents are obliged to observe the hygiene rules specified in separate regulations, especially when coughing and sneezing.

2. Organisational rules:

- 1) Accommodation in a student dormitory of an entitled person may take place after prior arrangement of the day and time with the administration of the respective student dormitory by e-mail or telephone. Telephone numbers can be found on the website of the Office for Student and Academic Dormitories in the Toruń part and the Office for Student and Academic Dormitories CM in the Bydgoszcz part.
- 2) No more than five people can be accommodated at the same time on the designated date and time. In order to facilitate accommodation, a person taking accommodation may enter with one accompanying person. The maximum stay of the accompanying person is limited to 1 hour. The accompanying person is obliged to leave his/her contact details with the administration or the reception desk.
- 3) No more than two persons may be accommodated in a room in the student residence; this does not apply to persons with a shared household and vaccinated persons.
- 4) It is advisable to bring your own bed linen, blankets, quilts and pillows, which will shorten the accommodation time. This recommendation does not apply to foreign students.
- 5) Each resident receives a separate key to their room.
- 6) Any issues with the administration or reception of the student dormitory should be dealt with by e-mail or telephone.
- 7) Any overnight stay outside the student dormitory premises should be reported to the administration.
- 8) The common rooms, TV rooms and study rooms are closed.
- 9) Persons wishing to use the laundry room and the drying room must make an appointment at the reception of the student dormitory.
- 10) Named postal and courier deliveries, as well as shopping and meal deliveries ordered by persons with disabilities living in the student dormitory may be delivered directly to their rooms, subject to the general rules referred to in point 1.

3. Rules of conduct in the event of suspected coronavirus infection:

- 1) In the event of alarming symptoms suggesting coronavirus infection, the administration or reception should be informed immediately by telephone. It is necessary to refrain from moving in the common parts of the building. One must strictly adhere to the instructions and directions given.
- 2) The person referred to in point 1 should be instructed to report as soon as possible to the nearest infectious disease ward to consult a doctor, by travelling there by own transport or by dialling 999 or 112. The person should await transport in a designated room (isolation room).
- 3) The student hostel manager or other authorised person shall be notified immediately of the area in which a person has moved and stayed in whom symptoms suggestive of coronavirus infection have been observed.
- 4) The head of the student residence shall establish (if possible) a list of persons present at the same time in the part or parts of the building where the infected person stayed and implement the application of the guidelines of the Chief Sanitary Inspector available at gov.pl/web/koronawirus and gis.gov.pl relating to persons who had contact with the infected person.
